COUNCILLOR LINDA BUCHANAN

It has been a torrid year as the Council works hard to maintain a balanced budget. Awful decisions have had to be made regarding cuts including charging for garden waste collection and all car parks, though between us we managed to persuade the council to keep Shavington car park free.

The part of the role I enjoy most is representing residents and trying to get issues sorted. Some things I have had success with, others haven't been quite so successful and some things are out of the control of the council.

So what has been good?

The area around the Co-op continues to be a ray of sunshine even in the dark days of winter. There are three of us now who look after this patch of land. We take a month each in rotation to keep the weeds down and cut back when necessary. Please do contact me if you would like to volunteer to help.

Establishing a closer working relationship between Cheshire Police and Cheshire East Enforcement. PCSO Dan Walley and Enforcement arrange spot checks regarding illegal parking on a Sunday morning outside the Alex Soccer Centre on Crewe Road. The illegal parking has been a problem for years and whilst spot checks are not ideal, it does act as a deterrent though sadly some people continue to park illegally.

140 Rope Lane was saved from demolition when the current owner bought the building. I meet with him as I am keen to see how the renovation is progressing. He is passionate about renovating Victorian buildings and whilst the 3 homes will suit modern living, he is maintaining the integrity of the external structure of the building ensuring that part of the rich heritage of Shavington is protected.

...and what is ongoing

Flooding, partly caused by house building and partly caused by the increasing number of storms we experience year on year. There are a number of areas I have followed up on behalf of residents but two areas of particular concern where I am in regular contact with the flood and drainage teams is Rope Lane and Crewe Road to try and find out the source and solution to the constant running water from opposite to the Vine Pub up to Burlea Drive. On Crewe Road the flood team is working on a complex problem where flooding is so bad, some houses have been flooded. This is an incredibly distressing situation for the families involved. If your home or business is flooding, call 0300 123 5020 and ask to speak to the flood risk team. Outside of working hours (8.30am to 5pm), call 0300 123 5025.

Missed bin collections are the exception rather than the rule and whenever I can I will contact ANSA on behalf of residents to see if a missed road is on the "mop up" list. If you ever experience a missed collection you need to report it within two days. The best way to report a missed bin collection is by completing the form on the Cheshire East website. If you are unable to use the form, call the Waste and Recycling Customer Service Team on 0300 123 5011 during office hours, 8.30am to 5pm Monday to Friday.

Developers not fulfilling their conditions, for example, three street lights opposite to Alfred Potts still don't work. Cheshire East won't adopt housing estates until all conditions are fulfilled.

There is much more going on and I continue to visit road groups in Shavington chatting to residents. On my last walk about most residents commented on what a friendly place Shavington is and how much they love living here.

Since its official opening in April 1995, Crewe and Nantwich u3a has grown from an organisation comprising several small but popular groups, to one where members have the choice of over 95 groups, covering subjects ranging from Art Appreciation to Yoga Fit. (We do not have a Zoology or Zen group, but we would welcome anyone who wants to start one!)

Members pay a yearly fee (currently £14) then choose to join those groups which cover their interests, such as painting, listening to opera, fitness groups at Shavington Gym (charge set by the gym), pickleball and table tennis, various Bridge groups, reading, Book Chat, local history, crafts and needlework, a team quiz, languages, choirs and many others. Groups meet weekly, fortnightly or monthly.

Our walking groups cover distances between 2-8/9 miles and some of them combine walking with a meal in a pub near the location of the walk. Venue-based groups attract a £1.50 levy to cover group and room hire costs. Outdoor groups, where there is no cost to candnu3a to hire a venue, attract no levy.

There is a monthly Medieval History group which meets online and we also have a face to face IT Help group which can be accessed weekly. We are always keen to speak to members who would like to start a new group and share their interests with others.

'I was sad to think of the group closing as we all enjoyed it so much. I decided to offer to lead the group after the group

leader announced she wanted to step down. I love being the leader of such a friendly and interesting group.' (member and new Group Leader)

Crewe and Nantwich u3a is completely volunteer-led, and as a charity, is run by a committee of 12 trustees. Many other members contribute by leading groups, supporting group leaders with other tasks, undertaking publicity work and compiling the newsletter, plus other tasks which assist the trustees in running legally and efficiently.

Membership is open to those no longer in full-time employment and there is no lower or upper age, although most of our members are between 50 - 90.


